BAPTISM

Registration during the early stages of pregnancy for the Baptism course is strongly recommended.

CONFIRMATION

All students, including those in Catholic schools, are to register in August of their junior year of high school. Call the office for registration requirements.

FIRST PENANCE AND FIRST COMMUNION

All children, including those in Catholic schools, should be registered at the beginning of their second grade year in order to participate in the sacramental preparation.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- First through tenth -graders meet on Tuesday evenings, October-April.
- Vacation Bible School, for children ages 4-10, is held for one week each summer.
- Confirmation students must complete 24 hours of high school religious education prior to their junior year.
- Adults wishing to learn more about their Catholic faith, including those wishing to become members of the Catholic Church, should call the office to speak with Gerrie Baumbouree.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

The church can be reserved as much as 18 months before a wedding. In most cases, diocesan policy requires an appointment six months prior to the wedding date. Couples are required to attend a diocesan marriage preparation course. Please view wedding guidelines on the parish web site, under Our Parish.



The Mass, Two Parts

The Mass is divided into two major parts; the Word and the Eucharist. This format has its roots in the beginning of Christianity from Luke's account of the disciples' journey to Emmaus in which Christ explained the scriptures to them and then revealed himself in the breaking of the bread (Luke 22:14-20). The New Testament reports the practice of reading and hearing apostolic writings in Christian communities. (Acts 2:42 & 1 Cor. 11:23-34) The *Didache*, written around the year 60 A.D., tells us of the structure of their Eucharist and by the year 150 A.D., the general structure of the Eucharistic liturgy was established. Justin Martyr writes that there were two readings by a lector, a homily by the priest, the bringing up of the gifts, the Eucharistic Prayer, the distribution of Communion and a collection.

PASTOR'S CORNER

October 14 & 15, 2017

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

More and more we seem to be challenged to assist our neighbors in their hour of need. Natural disasters and the economy have reeked havoc on our available resources. Yet as Christians, this is what we are called to do. Those who have been blessed and spared are called to help those less fortunate.

I wanted to thank all of you who continue to support the Bishop's Services Appeal and the Centennial Campaign: Building Our Future Together. The monies given to these campaigns and the second collections that are taken up for special needs assist the Catholic Church and the Diocese of Lafayette to directly assist those most affected and in need.

At a recent priest convocation Deacon Jeff Trumps put together the following information to remind priests of "Who we are" as the Diocese of Lafayette. With his permission I wanted to share this information with you. We should indeed be proud of our Catholic Church, our Diocese, and our Parish for the work that we do – together.

"Who are we? Who is the Diocese of Lafayette? To be Scriptural, we are many parts, but together form one body. TOGETHER we are the body of Christ in Acadiana. We are the **Diocese of Lafayette**.

- · We are 121 parishes, 29 missions and 32 schools
- We employ 2,000 full-time employees and 2,000 part-time employees with as many if not more volunteers offering service to our churches and schools
- · Combined our income exceeds \$100 million
- And we have insured assets of almost \$1 billion (buildings valued at more than \$850 million)

By any measure, we are among the 20 largest corporations in Acadiana!

- · We operate a \$100 million bank that pays above market interest on deposits and charges below market interest on loans
- · Our Priest Pension plan pays out more than \$1 million in benefits to 39 retired priests
- · We have a healthcare program with crazy low premiums for all of our employees and extremely low deductibles and co-pays for our lay employees and our priests pay no deductibles or co-pays
- · We educate more than 14,000 students in our schools, and
 - ♦ If they were to attend public schools it would cost more than \$500 million to construct the buildings alone not to mention the cost of educating those students
 - ♦ And we minister to college students at two major universities
- · We welcome the stranger through our migration office and provide targeted ministry to Hispanic, Vietnamese and Black Catholics

THE HEAVENLY BANQUET

The mountain of the Lord described in today's first reading is a place where there is no more hunger, no more weeping, and no more division of any kind. We need to pause and ponder these images every now and then, especially given the fact that we live in such a fractured world. The responsorial psalm continues to paint a picture of a place where only goodness and kindness flourish. These readings describe the heavenly banquet, to which God calls each of us through baptism and continues to call us throughout our lives. Let us "RSVP" to God's invitation and live our lives consistent with gospel values so that one day we will be welcomed to the table of the kingdom.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In 1971, the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship completed a survey of the presidents of the national liturgical commissions around the world. How were children doing in the liturgical reform? Probably to their surprise, the cardinals learned of special weekday Masses for children designed to teach them how to participate on Sunday, Masses with separate components for children. The decision was made quickly to develop adaptations for Masses where children were a majority of the assembly. Changes would include a simpler structure, understandable texts, a simplified Lectionary, more active participation, and most surprisingly, new Eucharitic Prayers. By 1973 the work was done, and with very specific advice from Pope Paul VI, including the need for two new Eucharistic Prayers, the Directory for Masses with Children was published on December 20, a timely Christmas gift for the children of the world.

The prayers are the first to be written fresh in a modern language - not Latin, but French and German - than translated into English, Italian, and Spanish. With a sense of caution, these new prayers were approved for three years, until 1977, but it soon became apparent that they had truly been embraced.
