BAPTISM

Registration during the early stages of pregnancy for the Baptism course is strongly recommended.

CONFIRMATION All students, including those in public and Catholic schools, register in August of their junior year of high school. Call the office for registration requirements.

FIRST PENANCE AND FIRST COMMUNION

All children, including those in public and Catholic schools, register at the beginning of their second grade in order to participate in the sacramental preparation.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (1st thru 11th grades, including Confirmation)

- Registration for all sections of Religious Education is in August
- First through tenth grades meet on Tuesday evenings
- Confirmation classes meet on Monday evenings
- Vacation Bible School, for children ages 4-10, is held for one week each summer, when scheduled
- Confirmation students must complete 24 hours of high school religious education prior to their junior year.
- Adults wishing to learn more about their Catholic faith, including those wishing to become members of the Catholic Church, should call the office to speak with Gerrie Baumbouree.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

The church can be reserved only after meeting with the Priest/Deacon to begin marriage preparation for the couple. It is recommended that an appointment be made one (1) year in advance of the anticipated date of the wedding. Marriage preparation requirements, policies and guidelines are reviewed and must be completed prior to any marriage in the church.

Religious Education Registration



The month of August has been set aside as registration for CCD classes grade 1st-10th, Confirmation, First Communion, and Home Study. Labeled packets will be available in the Gathering area of our church and in our office next to the church in the Ministries Building. Please remember that a copy of the child's Baptism **MANDATORY** Certificate is for 1st **Communion & Confirmation Registration TO BE COMPLETE!** It is also imperative that you register during this month because our numbers for the Sacraments gets high in a short time. We don't want to disappoint anyone! You may return the completed packets to the office. Our office hours are 8:30AM to 1:00PM, Monday thru Thursday. If you are unable to get here between those hours, please leave the packet in our dropoff box to the left of the office door.

We must let the $1-10^{\text{th}}$ parents know: that in-person classes depend upon if we have teachers for your class. If not, than Home Study will again be required.

Natural Family Planning (NFP) is a general title for ethical, natural, safe and effective methods for both achieving and

avoiding pregnancy in marriage. NFP methods teach couples how to observe and interpret the wife's signs of fertility and infertility. In the words of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, NFP methods "respect the bodies of the spouses, encourage tenderness between them and favor the education of an authentic freedom." (CCC, no. 2370)

INTERNATIONAL PILGRIM VIRGIN STATUE TO VISIT OUR LADY OF FATIMA PARISH



The world-famous International Pilgrim Virgin Statue which has been traveling globally since 1947 is coming to Our Lady of Fatima Catholic Church on Friday, August 6th.

It was sculpted in 1947 by the famous Portuguese artist Jose Ferreira Thedim (1892-1971) to reflect the precise instructions of Sister Lucia. The sculpture's image is based off of Our Lady's position when she revealed herself as the Immaculate Heart of the Shepherds in 1917.

Prior to its first pilgrimage of May 13, 1947, Pope Pius XII blessed the statue. The pilgrimage was made to celebrate and commemorate the 30th anniversary of the apparition of the Blessed Mother.

In the spring of 1947, the statue toured for the first time in Europe. After this tour, it was retired and put on display at the Basilica of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal, where it still resides today.

On October 13, 1947, a "twin" statue was blessed by the Bishop of Liera, Fatima, and commissioned to serve as the Pilgrim Virgin, touring and bringing the blessings of Fatima to the world.

After the blessing in October, John Haffert, co-founder of The Blue Army, was entrusted to bring the statue to the United States with the Bishop's prayer that Mary herself accompany the statue wherever it goes. With the counsel and aid of Sister Lucia, Haffert composed the

Blue Army Pledge, and went on to spread the Message of Fatima worldwide, largely through the Pilgrim Virgin Statue tours.

In 1950, the first U.S tour of the statue took place, covering more than 50 dioceses in the United States. On October 24, 1952, Pope Pius XII blessed the statue and imparted a special blessing on the work of the Fatima Pilgrim Tours.

The statue has since visited more than 100 countries, including Russia and China, with numerous miracles and graces reported wherever the statue has visited.

The purpose of the Pilgrim Virgin Statue tours is to bring the graces of Fatima and Our Lady's message of hope, peace and salvation to the millions of people who may never have an opportunity to make a pilgrimage to Fatima itself.


